Conditions of Entry and Rules of Show, 1932.

1—Entries Close absolutely on **TUESDAY, AUGUST 9th, 1932**, after which no entry can be received. This Rule will be rigidly enforced.
2—Printed Entry Form can be obtained from Secretary, and no entry will be received except on such Entry Forms and **unless the prescribed fees accompany them.**

3—**Cheques or P.O.s to be made payable to Hon. Treasurers, Messrs. E. J. Byrne and M. J. Butler.**

4—Exhibitors alone are responsible for the correctness of entries and are requested to write them clearly and distinctly.

5—They are only accepted on the understanding that there shall be no appeal beyond the Committee of the Show, whose decision shall be final.

6—The same Exhibitor may compete in class higher than his own on payment of fee for such class.

7—All Exhibits, except Entries for Jumping, must be in their places not later than ten o'clock on day of Show. Jumping Entries by two o'clock.

8—Exhibitors may enter the same exhibit in the Cattle and Horses Section in as many classes as they are eligible for, provided that they pay the necessary entry fee in each class.

9—An Exhibitor will not, under any circumstances, be awarded more than Two First Prizes or more than Two Second Prizes with the same exhibit.

10—The Committee reserve the right to refuse any entry unconditionally. A meeting of the Committee for the passing of Entries before going to Press will be held immediately after date of closing, and no Entry Fee will be refunded after the Entries have gone to Press.

11—Age of Animal to be correctly stated at entry. Age to date from 1st January. Poll Angus from 1st December.

12—Exhibits to be the Bona Fide property of Exhibitor at time of Entry. Any breach of this Rule, the Exhibitor shall forfeit all prizes he has won at said Show.

13—Pure-bred Cattle means Cattle entered or eligible for entry in Herd Book of respective Breeds. Pedigree to be stated in entry form. In case of Bulls the number of the sire in the Herd Book and the breeding of the dam to g.g. dam also to be set forth in entry form.

14—Every Animal must be supplied with a sufficiently strong halter.
15—A number to be attached to each Exhibit will be forwarded to Exhibitors three days before date of Show. An Exhibit to appear in more than one class must have a number for each class.

16—Rosettes not allowed on any Exhibit while being judged.
17—Each Subscriber of £1 and over will be entitled to Free Admission to the Show, and will be sent admission card, provided subscription be paid before date of Show.

18—One person only will be admitted free with each Exhibit. Except in the case of Bulls or other animals being led, when two are allowed.

19—No Exhibitor will be allowed to enter Ring while Judging is going on, except same is in charge of Animal for purposes of leading, driving, or riding. Any breach of this Rule will lead to disqualification.

20—The decision of Judges to be final.

21—The Judges may withhold Prizes for want of merit, but only in extreme cases will this be resorted to.
